Over 15 federal and provincial funding programs are available to offset expenses as an incentive to employers to open their doors to Camosun students.

WIL FUNDING PROGRAMS

SWPP EXAMPLE

If you hire a student to work 35 hours a week at \$17.00/hour for 12 weeks, normally, your total cost for wages will be \$7,140.

But with SWPP, your total cost would be \$1,785.

You are not able to stack or combine federal wagesubsidies. In certain cases you may be able to combine provincial funding with SWPP funding.



Student Work Placement Program (SWPP)

This program has 12 delivery partners that offer funding opportunities for employers to hire students for the purposes of work-integrated learning. Canadian Employers are eligible to receive 75% wage coverage up to a maximum \$7,500 until April 30, 2021. The 75% SWPP wage subsidy could possibly be extended past April 30th, 2021 or it may revert back to the pre-Covid amount of 50% coverage.



Mitacs Business Development Internship

The CC-BSI award will provide \$10,000 per co-op or internship student to undertake a 12-16 week development project to help organizations restore or modify their business operations in a new business environment. Participating partner organizations will contribute \$5,000 for a total award of \$10,000 to be used towards a student stipend.



BC Provincial Programs

Employers hiring students for WIL can receive grants to subsidize wages through the Innovate BC's Tech Grants program, and the Innovator Skills Initiative Grant program.

The BC Arts Council's Co-op Placement Program is also available for arts and cultural organizations in BC.



Canada Summer Jobs

The program provides wage subsidies to employers from not-for-profit organizations, the public sector, and private sector organizations with 50 or fewer full-time employees, to create quality summer work experiences for young people aged 15 to 30 years. Funded employers are not restricted to hiring students — all youth aged 15 to 30 years may be eligible participants.

SWPP FUNDING DELIVERY PARTNERS

SWPP funding, through Employment Social Development Canada (ESDC), has 12 delivery partners. [†]Employers are eligible to receive 75% wage coverage until April 30th, 2021.
